The Accessibility Advisory Committee consists of 12 members appointed by City Council that includes individuals with disabilities or primary caregivers.

The Committee's mandate is to provide advice on the development, implementation and evaluation of guiding principles, policies, strategies, and programs to position Regina as a model community for the inclusion of all citizens including persons with disabilities.

This committee also hears appeals in accordance with the Paratransit Policy and Procedure Guide.

As part of this mandate, the Committee provides an annual forum for persons with disabilities to raise issues and concerns that will help Regina become an inclusive community.

Interested community members, stakeholders and partners who have an interest in accessibility issues are encouraged to attend one of two forums and bring a voice on important issues to help the City of Regina formulate future plans in the areas of:

- **Transit (including Paratransit)**
- **Pedestrian Traffic (including sidewalks and curbs)**
- **Snow Removal**

Subject experts from the City will begin the sessions with a presentation. There will be a short question and answer period followed by a facilitated exercise to identify the strengths, challenges and solutions in each of the subject areas.

The input received from the Accessibility Forum will be used by the Accessibility Advisory Committee to formulate recommendations to City Council on the three subject areas. It will also result in a public report that will be available on the City of Regina website.
