



Marital status for the population aged 15 years and over in private households







Highest certificate, diploma or degree for the population aged 15 years and over in private households




Population aged 15 years and over by Labour force status



Private Households, After-Tax Income Private Households, Pretax Income




Population, by age group, with After Tax Income Below the Low Income Measure






Population by Aboriginal Identity







Population by Immigration Category

Immigrant Population by Year of Immigration








- 4) All of the figures except the total population and the breakdown by age and sex are based on the population living in private dwellings, that is, not in collective dwellings. Collective dwellings include rooming houses, hotels, motels, nursing homes, hospitals, staff residences, group homes, and corrections facilities.
