## **Subject: Johnson Collegiate Fare-Free Pilot Project Update**

Dear members of Regina City Council,

On behalf of the Regina Catholic School Division, we would like to share the importance of accessible and affordable transit for students.

Many of our students rely on public transit each day to attend school, access extracurricular opportunities, and fully participate in their education. Transit is not optional for a significant number of our families, it is essential.

We recognize the recent report on the fare-free pilot at F.W. Johnson Collegiate, which demonstrated that when transit is affordable, student ridership increases significantly and students make regular use of the service to travel to and from school. This reinforces what we see across our schools: when barriers are reduced, students are better able to access education.

While we understand there are financial considerations associated with transit operations, we remain concerned about the impact that transit costs, whether through fare increases or existing fare levels, have on students and families. As living costs continue to rise, transit fares represent a growing barrier for those already facing financial pressures.

From our perspective as an education partner, the key consideration is student access. When transportation becomes unaffordable, it can limit students' ability to attend school consistently, participate in programming, and remain engaged in their education. Removing or reducing these barriers supports equitable access for all students.

We also note that the original intent of exploring fare-free transit for high school students aligns with broader goals of equity, inclusion, and community well-being. Supporting students' ability to travel safely and reliably to school contributes to their success and to the overall health of our community.

As such, we respectfully encourage City Council to:

- Continue exploring options that improve affordability of transit for youth; and
- Continue to engage with education partners as decisions are considered, recognizing the direct impact on students and families.

We remain committed to working collaboratively with the city and community partners to support student success while respecting the roles and responsibilities of each organization.
