Happy New Year! I hope that 2024 brings everyone good health, wellbeing and success.

2024 will be a busy year for Regina City Council. Along with the high number of reports and motions that we consider at our meetings, this is an election year for municipalities and school boards. The election will be held on Wednesday, November 13, 2024.

There will be new ward boundaries in Regina established for the election. Ward 1 will no longer cover Lakeview, Normandy Heights and River Heights: those neighborhoods will become part of Ward 3. Ward 1 will continue to cover Whitmore Park, Hillsdale, Badham Blvd/Broadway area and will expand to include Boothill and part of the residential area in the downtown core.

I will mail a newsletter to Ward 1 residents in May with the map of current and new ward boundaries. Watch for it in your mailbox!

Highlights of 2024 City of Regina Budget

City of Regina 2024 Budget Highlights

On December 18, 2023, after four days of discussion, City Council passed the 2024 budget.

Some of the highlights of the budget include:

2.85 per cent increase to mill rate for 2024

3 per cent increase to the base utility rate (was reduced from 4 per cent)

The average homeowner with a property assessed at \$315,000 will experience an increase of \$19.79 per month between their property tax (\$5.57), utility rate (\$5.70) and waste services costs (\$8.52).

Inflation and rising construction costs have put major pressures on our City's finances, as well as other cities across the country. I am happy to report that we have been able to keep the property tax increase lower than other major cities such as Saskatoon implementing a 6.04 per cent increase, Edmonton increasing its mill rate by 6.6 per cent and Calgary's mill rate going up 7.8 per cent.

We'll have some construction this spring and I will share details with you when they become available.

New Warming Centre at Carmichael Outreach

The City of Regina provided \$100,000, in addition to \$200,000 from the Province to Carmichael Outreach in the Heritage neighborhood for the operation of an overnight warming centre. The City provided a warming bus in that area from January 10 to 18. The warming centre opened January 19.

The funding comes from the City's Cold Weather Strategy budget, which also funds the warming centre Awsiw at All Nations Hope in North Central neighborhood.
