ACC26-8 Annual Winter Maintenance Summary 2025/2026 Season

Recommendation

The Accessibility Advisory Committee recommends that the Executive Committee recommend at its meeting on September 16, 2026, that City Council:

1. Amend the Winter Maintenance Policy (Policy) to add snow clearing on sidewalks adjacent to select locations in the Regina Growth Plan, including Urban Corridors and the City Centre, as shown in Appendix D-Amendment 1;
2. Amend the Policy to add snow clearing on sidewalks adjacent to school zones, as outlined in Appendix D-Amendment 1;
3. Amend the Policy to remove the winter maintenance objective related to Sandboxes as outlined in Appendix D-Amendment 2;
4. Amend the Policy to revise the hours of operation at the Snow Storage Site as outlined in Appendix D-Amendment 3;
5. Amend the Policy Appendix A (Operational Policy-Level of Service) to include information outlined in Appendix D-Amendment 4;
6. Direct Administration to bring winter maintenance service level enhancements on sections of Dewdney Avenue and 11th Avenue corridors for Council consideration as part of the 2027 budget process;
7. Direct Administration to bring an increase to the Snow Storage Site User Fees in *The Clean Property Bylaw No. 9881* for Council consideration as part of the 2027 budget process;
8. Remove item *CR25-116* from the List of Outstanding Items for City Council; and
9. Approve these recommendations at its September 23, 2026, meeting.
