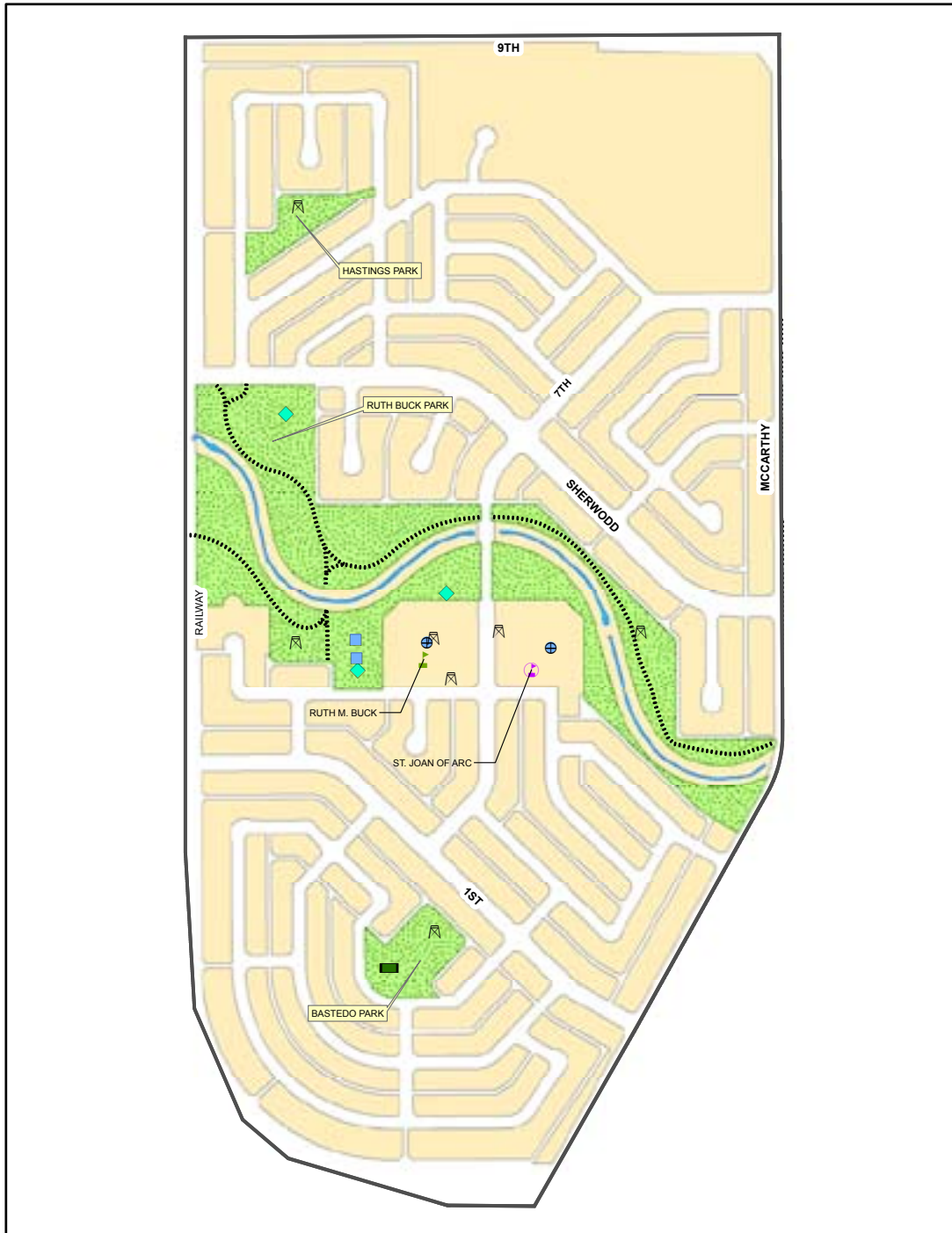
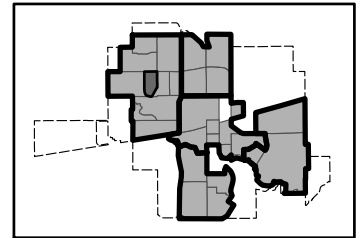

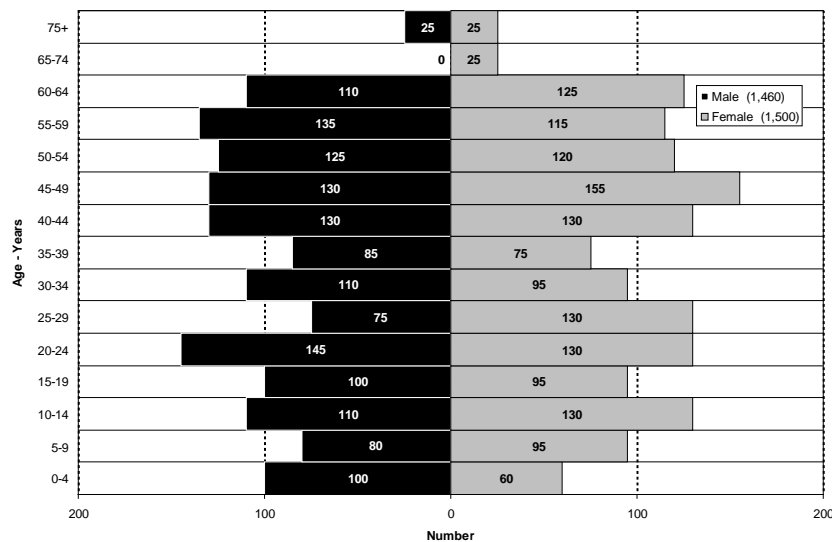
## Normanview West Neighbourhood

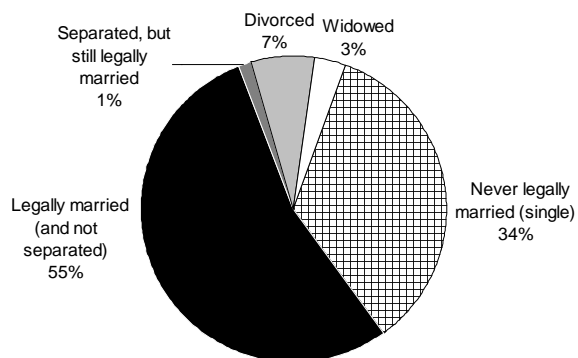


Normanview West - Peonies on a sunny block

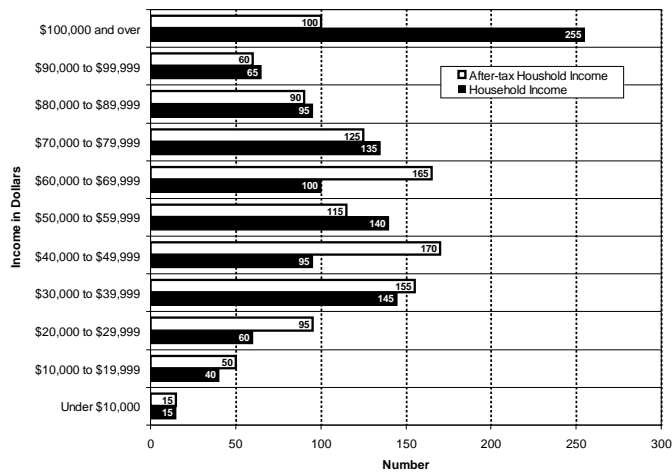

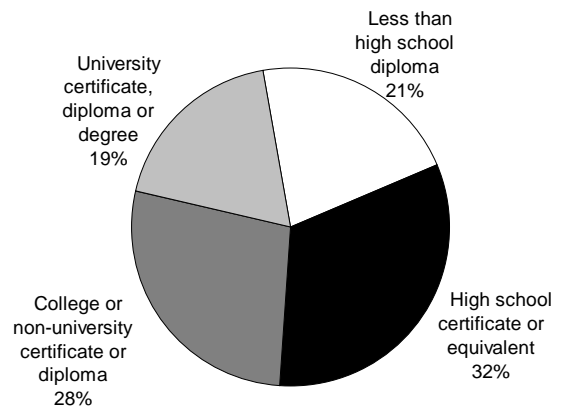

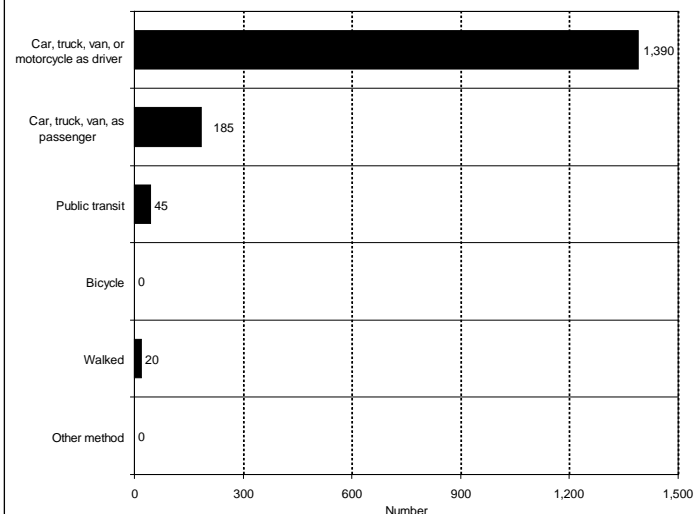

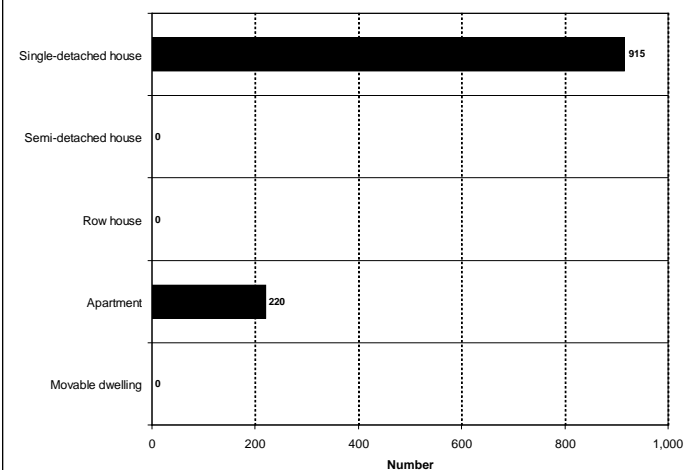
### Labour Force Activity (15 years and over)



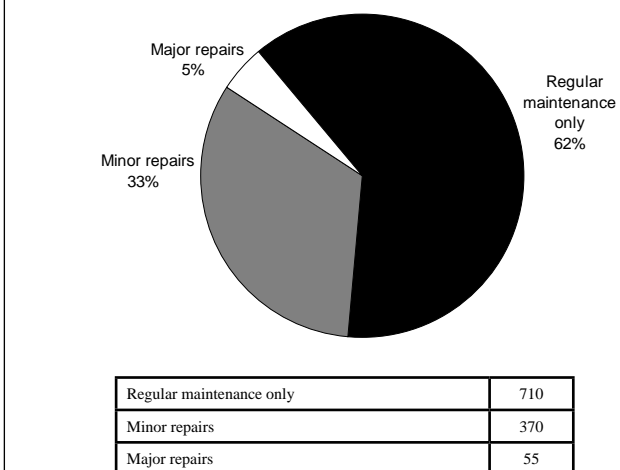
### Mode of Transportation (employed labour force)



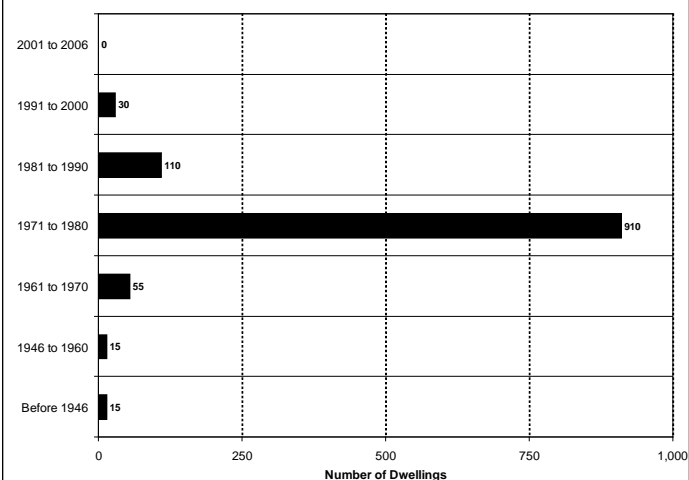
